Persons with Developmental Disabilities (PDD)

Children and Family Services

Offers a range of support and resources for children, youth (up to 18 years in age) and families across the province.

Family Resource Networks

Deliver prevention and early intervention services and supports for children and youth aged 0 to 18 and their families.

Métis and Indigenous Children's Services

Specific services provided through Metis and Indigenous Children and Family Services offices and Delegated First Nation Agencies.

Alberta Foster and Kinship Association

This offers resources and support for foster and kinship caregivers, including training materials and guidance documents.

Family Resource Centers

Help caregivers navigate their family managed agreement and provide information about disability supports and services.

Family & Community Support Services (FCSS)

Each FCSS determines the programs they will put in place as preventive services for the local community.

Hope for Wellness

Helpline that is available to Indigenous people across Canada by telephone and online 24/7.

AHS Indigenous Support Line

Indigenous listeners will answer your questions and help you get culturally appropriate care.

Alberta Seniors Housing Directory

Contains a listing of all available seniors housing options.

Blue Cross Client Directed Home Care Program

Supports to live at home independently for as long as possible.
